The SGI UMC Prison Ministry Program continues to make disciples for Christ despite the challenging METH drug culture in Franklin County. On May 24, the prison ministry will celebrate the graduation of three inmates from Fresh Start Visions County Jail Ministry Program. Fresh Start is a two part (in-side & outside phases), faith-based character developmental program that teaches pro-social behavior. Charleston, SC and Panama City, FL. Currently, 10 church volunteers are involved in prison ministry and work diligently with men and women inmates in the county jail & local prisons during the year to deliver biblically-based curriculums that includes Bible Study, Celebrate Recovery Substance Abuse, Character Attributes, Anger Management, GED, etc. Inmates are taught to accept responsibility for their actions, deal respectfully with authority and be accountable as they break the chains of drug addiction and recidivism. While incarcerated they develop a closer relationship with God and are introduced to His plan for them to have a more abundant life. Most importantly, ex-offenders go on to become law-abiding, tax-paying citizens and use their personal experiences and testimonies to help bring others to Christ.
